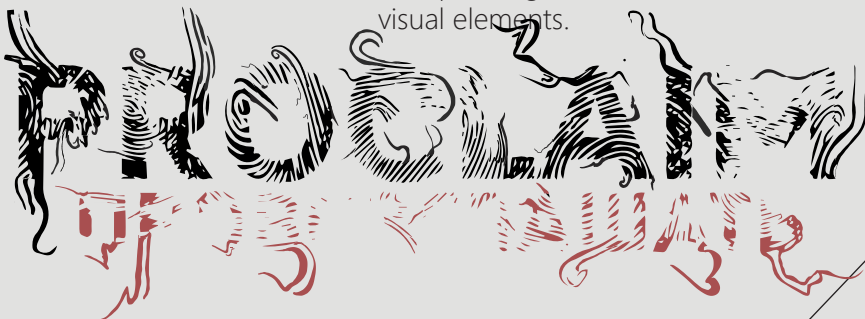
that they deserve.

A three part exhibition explore the past, present and future of the disaster. Keeping a prime focus on the education of those that visit the space, revealing interesting facts and new concepts into the minds of those who step into the space.

The exhibition takes place within the Dnipro metro station in Kiev, Ukraine. Opening at precisely twenty three minutes past one on the morning of the 26th April, the exact time of the exploding occuring at Chernobyl. And remaining open for 14 days, until the exact day the fire was extinguished in the reactor over thirty years ago.

supporting bi lingual systems to accomodate for the widest audience, the PROCLAIM space also supports a digital app whereby visitors can explore the "Hidden Heroes" of Chernobyl, learning about their stories and taking them back home with you. Much of the exhibition contains interactive features as well as incorporating various visual elements.

The exhibition takes a focus on the enormnity of the impact that Chernobyl has had and will continue to have on the environment surrounding it and the world around the country involved.

At 1:23:45am. An explosion occurred within a small ukrainian town that changed the nuclear industry for ever. The result was the worst nuclear disaster that the world has ever seen, caused by a vicious combination of human and scientific error.

Many of the true facts of the Chernobyl disaster had been hidden amongst the soviet union for as long as it could be hidden. The unraveling of the facts alongside the people involved has brought the true facts to light, the PROCLAIM exhibition works to educate those who visit the space and gain new knowledge and insight into a phenomenon that should never have happened, and will likely never happen again.

The PROCLAIM exhibition concentrates on the effects of the chernobyl disaster, as well as how the explosion came about and the facts that surround the disaster. Much worse disasters were narrowly avoided as well as a much higher death toll has been hidden from view for a number of years.

Some of the highest recorded levels of radiation located at chernobyl at the time of the accident were in excess of 300,000 roentgen. capable of delivering a fatal dose in under a minute.

Much of the radiation spread across multiple countries and covered the large majority of Europe. A dose of 2000 roentgen would prove fatal in one hour. Radiation levels this strong were located all across the immediate area surrounding the power plant.

Eventually the entire 50,000 population of Chernobyl had to be evacuated, although this was postponed for many days due to Russian officials attempting to cover the severity of the events that occurred. This has resulted in entire 50,000 population receiving a radiation dose of roughly 100 Roentgen. the equivalent of 1000 chest x-rays per hour.

A much larger impact was spotted amongst the large number of “liquidators” who were called in to perform the immediate clean up effort of Chernobyl, over 750,000 of these liquidators were made to work inside the exclusion zone set up to reduce the impact of radiation on the environment as those who are exposed to large amounts of radiation become emitters of deadly radiation themselves, harming those around them.

Amongst the 750,000 liquidators, there are a great number of them that prevented a much larger impact occurring from the fallout at Chernobyl. Men who delved deep into the power plant after the explosion and drained water tanks, men who scaled the heavily contaminated roof and literally shoveled parts of pure radioactive fuel back into the reactor. and thousands of individuals who worked within dangerous conditions to save millions more lives.

There were individuals who went directly against government warnings and entered the reactor buildings, as well as those who outed truths that saved thousands and prevented another disaster at this scale from ever happening again. Much of the faults at Chernobyl were down to human error, impatient staff and rushed safety tests. However the largest problem was scientific.

The reactor contained an “Emergency Shut Down” button. However this button was constructed with faulty parts that instead of shutting down the reactor, caused a large spike in power that made the mid tier power reactor into the most deadly atomic bomb ever made

Chernobyl began supplying power on September 26 1977. The first three reactors were built without complication, however the fourth reactor was build hastily and corners were cut which began the setup for the worst nuclear disaster the world has ever seen. February 1986: Soviet officals state that nuclear disasters are "1 in 10,000 years."

50,000 people were living in Chernobyl at the time of the disaster, being told they were only being evacuated for a temporary time period, residents were given 50 minutes to pack up their lives and then left the city, it remains totally abandoned over thirty years later, serving as a reminder of the cost that lies can cause.

Chernobyl will continue to be abandonned for decades, perhaps even centuries, while the half life of caesium 137 lasts for 30 years, taking 180 years to decay entiely.

The longest lasting unnatural radioactive isotope present at Chernobyl is Plutonium 239, each half life lasting 24,000 years, meaning it is enitry safe to say that Chernobyl will not become safe from radiation for any exhibition visiters lifetime.

Measures have been made to mend the damages created by the Chernobyl disaster, the most recent and most impactful of which is the New Safe Consignment building (NSC). The NSC is a colossal, moveable structure that was completed in 2017 and cost \$2 billion to create, the structure itself is an enourmous hanger looking structure that covers the entirety of the reactor buldings, being taller than the statue of liberty and weighing 3 times heavier than the eiffel tower.

The Chernobyl disaster constantly costs governments money to fix, The ukrainane govenment spends 20% of its funds to recover from the disaster, however to fully fix the effects it would take the 100% of availble funding and over 170 years of annual revenue available to the Ukranian govenment.

Over thirty years later, Chernobyl is still incredibly radioactive, some areas of the city still being capable of delivering a fatal dose in under an hour, the molten core of the reactor is still solidified under the building of reactor number four and if you were to remain in the same room as it for 10-20 minutes, your life expectancy is shortened to only a few weeks.

The vast majority of those being heavily affected by the loose radiation within the air following the disaster were children. causing their bodies to grow improperly or not growing at all, the radioactive genes and dna segments can cause problems that remain dormant for generations, waiting decades until complications can occur when new children are born

Due to the massive effect that radiation has had on the surrounding population, it is likely that the next generation of ukrainian citizens will struggle with working life and require much aid due to disabilities caused by radiation.
